Application Instructions

I. Entry Requirements

International students who meet the following requirements are eligible to apply:

- A. **Nationality:** An individual of foreign nationality who has never held the status of an Overseas Chinese student on the date of application, and who complies with the “Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan” of the Ministry of Education (MOE).
- B. **Qualification:** International students with a high school diploma are eligible to apply for undergraduate programs, a Bachelor’s degree for Master programs, and a Master’s degree for PhD programs.

II. Application Method

A. Online application

1. Log on to the online application system: <http://insch.ntcu.edu.tw/>
 2. Please take note of the following:
 - a. Remember the email address, account and password you used for applying. You will need those to log in to the system to modify application information and upload documents.
 - b. Download or print out the following documents which are automatically generated by the system after you have completed the online application: application form, Deposition and payment form or other required documents.
 - c. Comply strictly with the two steps below to complete payment and upload all the necessary documents before the designated deadline. Failure to do so may result in the cancellation of your application. All losses thus incurred shall be borne by the applicant.
- B. **Uploading Documents:** All applicants shall upload the required documents to the online application system. The documents may be uploaded separately and updated any time before the deadline. After uploading all the documents, applicants will be asked to confirm the submission of the documents. Please go through the documents carefully before confirming the submission. Applicants may not change the submitted documents for any reason once they have confirmed submission. NTCU will only process the documents last confirmed and submitted.

Required Certificates or Documents:

1. A copy of diploma of the highest academic degree.
2. A copy of Chinese or English translation of the diploma and a copy of the academic transcript, authenticated by ROC representative offices abroad.
3. A certified copy of the Chinese or English language Proficiency.

Note:

Chinese Language Proficiency Certificate Submission Requirements:

Please submit the original PDF file downloaded directly from the TOCFL registration system. Do not merge the file, save it as a new file, modify its contents, or perform any other actions that may affect the electronic signature, as doing so may interfere with the verification process.

4. A copy of passport or ID.
5. Personal resume and autobiography in English or Chinese (about 1,000 words required by the Department of English and Fine Arts; about 1,500 words required by the Department of Education for the doctoral program).
6. Study plan for bachelor programs / Research plan for graduate programs.
7. A copy of financial statement, authenticated by ROC representative offices abroad (minimum NT\$100,000 or US\$3,300).
8. Payment invoice/receipt of application fee.
9. Deposition: Please print out, sign and upload the signed copy back to the system.
10. Photograph: a close-up color shot of the head and shoulders (no hats) within the last 6 months. Please upload in JPG format.
11. Other materials that support the student's application.

※ **Note 1:** Applicants graduating in the current year may not have to upload a graduation certificate for application. However, they shall, upon admission, submit their academic credentials on the registration day for enrollment. Failure to do so will result in the cancellation of the admission offer.

※ **Note 2:** High school graduates whose qualifications are equivalent to Taiwan's high-school grade 5 may apply for undergraduate programs. However, admitted students shall complete at least 12 extra credits before graduation in accordance with relevant NTCU rules and regulations. The 12 credits are not included in the required credits for graduation.

 - a. Work for major : A CD or DVD of personal performance for 30 minutes. For students major in theory composer should hand in CD or DVD of personal performance and the notation/music book of it for at least three performances. (Three copies).
 - b. Work for minor : A CD or DVD of personal performance for 10 minutes. For students minor in theory composer should hand in CD or DVD of personal performance and the notation/music book of it for at least one performance.

(Three copies).

- c. No matter major or minor, piano as one instrument.
- d. Those works should be manifested by the instructors.

C. Note:

1. After the payment is completed, no refund will be given. All related costs and exchange differences shall be borne by the applicant. Please upload the “payment invoice/receipt” onto the online application system.
2. Applications with unpaid application fees will not be processed.

IV. Enrollment Time

- Fall Semester: The 1st semester of 2026 academic year (September, 2026)
- Spring Semester: The 2nd semester of 2026 academic year (February, 2027)

V. Terms of Study

The length of study and graduation requirements are different according to each institute/department's rules, further information is available at the Office of International Affairs website and Department websites. If any revisions occur, please give priority to the announcement from the department/institute.

- Undergraduate programs shall be completed within 4 to 6 years.
- Master programs shall be completed within 2 to 4 years.
- Doctoral programs shall be completed within 3 to 7 years.

VI. Admission Announcement

- A. After the application deadline, the final list of admitted students will be decided by the

Admissions Committee. A number of candidates may be put on a waiting list in case any admitted students fail to complete registration procedures.

 - C. Planned admission quotas for the 2026/2027 academic year (including spring and fall semesters in total): **76** undergraduate students, **30** master's students, and **1** doctoral student.
 - D. The result will be announced on the website and informed by the email in mid-June for the fall semester and in mid-December for the spring semester.
- ✧ Please provide the actual mailing address for receiving the admission notice. The applicant who misses registration deadline due to an incorrect mailing address provided shall assume full responsibility.

VII. Registration and Enrollment

- A. Admitted students shall be present at the university for registration on the date specified by presenting the original copy of passport, diploma, and the Chinese or English translation of school transcripts authenticated in ROC representative offices abroad (for authentication purpose only, will be returned immediately), or the status of admission shall be revoked. Those who have not had their documents authenticated by the time of application shall present the authenticated documents to the Office of Academic Affairs, within one month after the application result is announced, or the status of admission shall be revoked. Applicants who are going to graduate in the end of this school year shall have the documents reviewed by the Office of Academic Affairs before registration, or the status of admission shall be revoked.
- B. The admitted students should, following Article 22 of “MOE Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan”, provide proof of medical and personal accidental insurance papers insured outside ROC with validity from entering ROC up to at least six months upon enrollment. If already being insured at the national health insurance of ROC, the enrolled students only need to provide proof of the related insurance papers. The above-mentioned insurance papers issued outside ROC should be verified by ROC representative offices abroad.
- C. Transfer credits from other colleges/universities shall be governed by related regulations of NTCU.

If no specific registration date is provided, the tuition payment deadline shall be considered the registration date. 2. For students applying for suspension or voluntary withdrawal, the effective date for refund calculation is the date on which the student (or their guardian) formally submits the application to the school's relevant office. For students dismissed by school order, the effective date is the date the school's official dismissal notice is delivered. However, if the student continues attending classes due to an appeal or lawsuit against dismissal, the actual departure date from the school is used for calculation. 3. Students must complete all withdrawal procedures within the time limit specified by the school. If delays are caused by the student's own actions, the actual date of departure will be used for refund calculation. 4. Institutions may not collect any fees prior to the official start of the semester as indicated in the academic calendar.		

- C. Living expenses for each semester are approximately NT\$25,000-35,000. They may vary depending on individual preferences, book costs are at the student's expense and vary from program to program.

IX. Scholarship Information

NTCU provides a variety of scholarships for international degree students. Applicants will be asked whether to apply for NTCU scholarship s during the online degree application. No extra documents are needed. Please note that Taiwan Scholarship awardees are not allowed to apply for NTCU scholarships. For more details about For more details about scholarships, please refer to the attachment III(P31) "National Taichung University of Education Guidelines for International Student Scholarships Application".

X. Other Important Information

- A. Accepted by NTCU, applicants can get tuition fee waived in the first year. From the second year, international students should apply for the scholarship according to "NTCU Guidelines for International Students Scholarship Application".
- B. Students can apply for admission to only one department/institute. Wherever applicable, the applicants should take the written tests, interview, and/or technical tests as specified by each department/institute concerned. The original copy of passport or other identification(s) should be presented at the test.
- C. The admission of international students to NTCU is conducted in compliance with "Regulations Regarding International Undertaking Studies in Taiwan" of the Ministry of Education (MOE), subject to any changes that may come into effect by the last day of application.
- D. International students admitted to NTCU shall be revoked of their admission and/or dismissed from NTCU if any of the following terms is violated:
 1. Students who do not possess ROC nationality shall apply for admission to NTCU in

- the capacity of either an overseas Chinese or a foreigner, but NOT in both capacities.
2. Students who are ex-ROC citizens shall not apply for admission to an ROC college or university as international students within eight years after their ROC nationality is denied.
 3. International students who are admitted to an ROC college or university but later dismissed by the college or university shall not seek admission to another program of study in the same capacity.
 4. NTCU Students whose study is being suspended shall not apply for admission to the same program of study in the same department/institute.
- E. Diplomas and transcripts issued by schools overseas are subject to review in accordance with the Ministry of Education's Code Governing the Review of Overseas Educational Qualifications.
- F. After the payment is completed, no refund will be given under any circumstance, including in cases of incomplete applications, withdrawal of application, ineligibility, mistaken payment, or duplicate payment.
- G. International students admitted to NTCU shall be revoked of their admission and/or dismissed from NTCU if any defect is found in the applicants' qualifications for application or in the authenticity of the documents submitted. Those who have graduated shall have their diploma revoked.

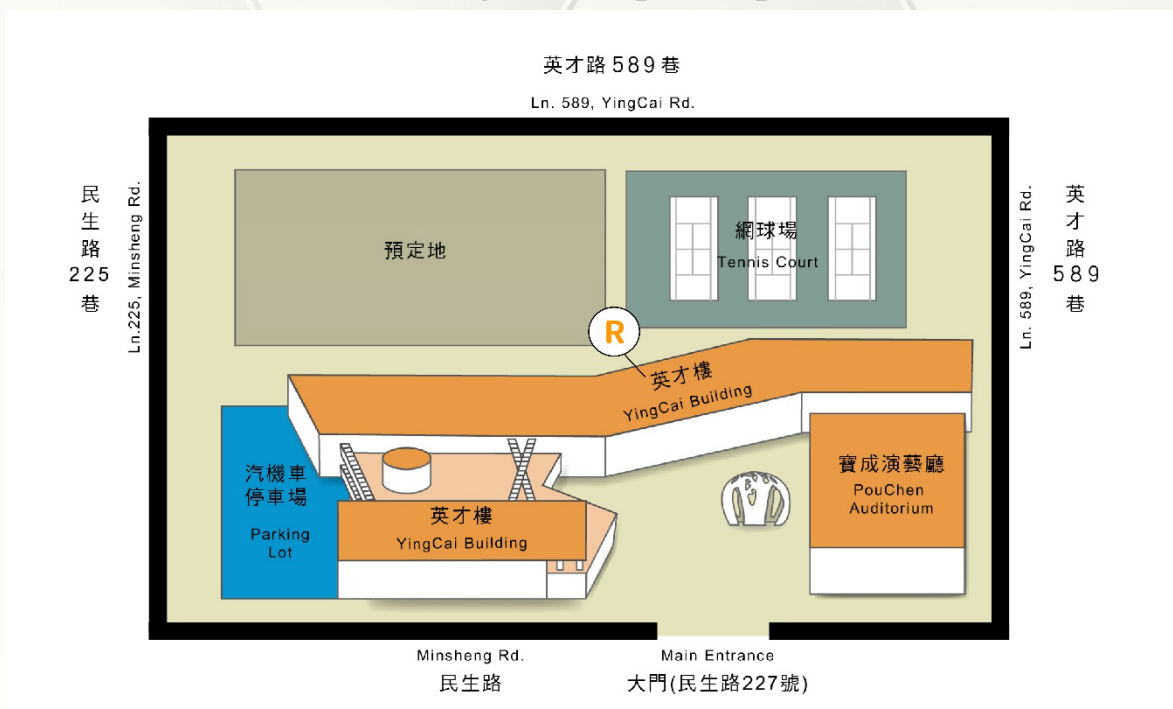
Location map of the whole campus

Introduction and Language Requirement of Dept./Inst.

There are 17 bachelor's programs, 22 master's programs and 3 doctoral programs that accept international students' application for admission to NTCU in the academic year of 2026. "The result of TOCFL that applicants should submit when applying for all programs taught in Chinese" listed in the following chart indicates the Chinese assessment, mainly the Test of Chinese as a Foreign Language (formerly known as TOCFL), held by the Steering Committee for the Test of Proficiency-Huayu (SC-TOP: <https://tocfl.edu.tw/tocfl/>).

Departments	Introduction	Language Requirements
Department of Education	The Department of Education has a rich history of developing specializations and programs related to educational practice and leadership. In 1987, the Department of Education began to offer a four-year undergraduate program of primary education. In 1992, the graduate institute for master degree of education was approved, and later the doctoral program since 2000. Currently, the Department of Education is composed of a certificate program for undergraduates, four graduate programs for master degree and one doctoral degree program. Since the mission of the Department of Education is to prepare students for pursuing their professional goals as certificated elementary school teachers as well as educational specialists. Therefore, those who enter the programs are requested to create, reflect, and advance their knowledge and professional practice experiences in teaching and learning. This mission is accomplished through many strategies, such as micro-teaching, practicum, and modeling. One of our goals is to provide students with knowledge, skills, and experiences to perform successfully as leaders in educational field. The certificate program is for undergraduates which prepares students to teach in schools and other relevant careers in education. Students are licensed to teach in elementary schools after passing their national examination and intern. The program, after a selective admission process, also accepts graduate students to pursue their career in teaching. Since the graduate programs offer the study in three areas: (1) General education (confer Master and Doctoral degree), (2) Curriculum and instruction (confer Master degree), and (3) Educational administration and management (confer Master degree). Students, in addition to be licensed teachers, may pursue advanced faculty positions and leadership roles in education. To sum up, students of the certificate program are eligible to take the national certificate examination and obtain the teacher license to teach in schools. Department of Special Education	● Established in 1993, our department currently offers an undergraduate program, a full-time master's program, and a part-time (in-service) master's program. We aim to train special education teachers for preschools and elementary schools, as well as professionals in special education and assistive technology. ● Our faculty team is composed of highly qualified scholars who hold doctoral degrees in special education or assistive technology from prestigious universities in Taiwan and abroad. Their areas of expertise span across all major fields of special education, including gifted education, intellectual disabilities, hearing impairments, visual impairments, learning disabilities, emotional and behavioral disorders, speech and language disorders, autism spectrum disorders, and multiple disabilities. Additional areas of specialization include speech-language therapy, physical therapy, art therapy, social work, and assistive technology. Our faculty are actively engaged in community outreach and support services, including consulting and assisting with teaching guidance, curriculum evaluation, instructional material development, and advisory work for local education bureaus in central Taiwan. ● The graduate program includes both full-time and part-time master's tracks. The full-time master's program offers two concentrations: (1) Special Education and (2) Assistive Technology and Applied Special Education. The part-time master's program holds evening classes and is designed to provide working professionals and in-service teachers with opportunities to further their expertise in special education and assistive technology.	◆ <u>Bachelor</u> TOCFL Level B1 ◆ <u>Master</u> TOCFL Level B1
Department of Physical Education	The Department of Physical Education was established in 1998. A master's program was added in 2005, and a post-service master's program was further established in 2011. Since the Department has been established, the main objective of the Department has been to acquire excellent teachers of physical education in elementary schools. In line with the university's reform, the Department made a major change in 2008. The "Sports and Health Management" courses were added to the undergraduate curriculum, to foster professional personnel in relation to sports and leisure management and sports health care. Since then, the Department's curriculums have been transformed into the two-track system, namely, teacher and non- teacher education. A class of students has been recruited for each undergraduate level. The admission system has three kinds of entrance: the review of students with good athletic performance, college entrance exams with a physical technical exam, and college admission (including	◆ <u>Bachelor</u> TOCFL Level A2 ◆ <u>Master</u> TOCFL Level B1

	the recommended plan of the Ministry of Education and application for admission with sport or non-sport specialty). Students of the Department have diverse characteristics. On one hand, students are good at various sports, such as canoeing, tennis, tchoukball, basketball, volleyball, badminton, table tennis, handball, swimming, track and field, water ballet, Chinese yoyo, dragon and lion dance, cycling, and so on. On the other hand, some non-sport specialized students which have excellent academic abilities are also recruited. The enrollment measures of the Department are aimed at creating a mutual learning and mutually driven educational environment. The master's course is divided into two groups, including "Sports Sciences" and "Sports Social Sciences". The goal of the program is to cultivate sports sciences and sports social research personnel. The establishment of post-service education courses is aimed at providing more learning opportunities for sports professionals and enriching their knowledge of physical education. In addition, the Department provides a "consecutive bachelor's and master's program", which allows excellent undergraduate students a direct path toward studying for a bachelor's and a Master's Program.	
Department of Early Childhood Education	The Department of Early Childhood Education was founded in 1992. The mission of the department of the early childhood education offers programs designed to assist prospective early childhood professionals for Taiwan early childhood teacher certification as well as endorsement for provide in-services training for field teachers to enhanced professional development of early childhood education. The Graduate Program in Early Childhood Education, focus on the researches of early childhood education related issues as well as to advance students' skill and ability on research. In 2011, the Graduate Institute of Early Intervention along with Experimental Center of Early Intervention was unified and became a program under the department of early childhood education. After the merger, the department became the only academic unit in Taiwan with both early intervention and early childhood education. ▲ Course planning: The bachelor programs in our department embedded the variety of teaching and teaching assessment method in our early childhood pre-services and early childhood care professional curriculum. In addition, curriculum design and teaching, early intervention, arts, languages, theories of basic education, and professional conservation courses. Furthermore, through professional planning, electives course of early childhood education are available for students every semester in order to improve their interest and expend their specialty area. Students in the department may also applied for join degree program which means completed both bachelors and Master program within five years, student in the senior years can start the start master level course. The master degree courses in our department included core courses and specialized courses. The core courses are divided into two groups which included basic theory and research methods. 	have graduate student diligent their professional competence, early childhood educational research and management, professional leadership and reflective critical thinking skills, and increasing graduate students' international perspectives and innovative research and development capabilities are the goals for this master program. Based on the design of the master program of early childhood education, the curriculum of master program of early intervention comprises integration and learning research across three areas which included medical rehabilitation, special education, and social work. The research methods and theories necessary for joining the research phase are composed of the same. ▲ Work outlet and Development: Student need to completed all course within four years of schooling. Student who are interest to work as a preschool teacher first need to past the national pre-school teaching certification exam, along with six months' student teaching. Early childhood education related career path such as early childhood literature creation and publications, early childhood music education, early childhood art education, early childhood physical education, or engaged in preschool education related industries. Student who are interest in research and in depth professional development may apply for entrance examination into early childhood education related graduate institutes or further their studies abroad. Graduates from graduate of early intervention program can work as early intervention specialist based on the professions that the students' undergraduate work for example pre-school teacher, early childhood special education teacher, social worker, and therapies. Student also will competent enough to supervise early intervention related work in a county or city government. In particular, in planning and execution, whether social welfare, medical rehabilitation, early childhood special education or early childhood education, students will be able to play to their strengths and achieve outstanding performance in the workplace.	
Graduate Institute of Education Information and Measurement	The Graduate Institute of Educational Information and Measurement (GIEIM) renamed from the Graduate Institute of Educational Measurement and Statistics (GIEMS) which was established in 1997. It is not only the first academic research institute concerning educational measurement in Taiwan, but also in Asia, and pioneers the cultivation of educational measurement researchers. In the 2013 academic year, an evening In-Service Master's Program was added. The undergraduate program follows a dual-track system: one for students enrolled in the Pre-service Teacher Training Program and one for those who are not. Students not in the teacher training track are required to complete 128 credits to graduate, while those in the teacher training track must complete 138 credits. The master's program consists of four main components: core courses, professional courses, research methodology courses, and practical application courses. To graduate, students must complete 36 credits, including 17 required credits in core courses and at least 4 credits in research methodology courses. The department currently has 10 full-time faculty members, including 3 professors, 3 associate professors, and 4 assistant professors, all of whom hold doctoral degrees from both Taiwanese and international universities. Faculty members specialize in a wide range of areas within counseling, guidance, and applied psychology, and they bring with them strong academic backgrounds along with extensive teaching and practical experience. Two faculty members have received Research Awards from the National Science and Technology Council (NSTC), and many serve as board directors or supervisors in professional academic associations. Applied musical performance is offered in areas such as piano, vocal, strings (violin, viola, cello, double bass) woodwinds (flute, oboe, clarinet, bassoon), brass (trumpet, horn, trombone, tuba), percussion, and composition. Students are widely engaged in various ensemble opportunities such as chorus, symphony orchestra, and chamber music ensembles. Traditionally, this program has contributed to the preparation of elementary school teachers. Today, students can pursue diverse directions such as performance, composition, music business, music technology, and other related areas. Master of Music (M.M.) - I. These Guidelines, known as “Guidelines of the National Taichung University of Education to Grant Scholarships to International Students” (hereinafter referred to as the “Guidelines”) are duly enacted by National Taichung University of Education (hereinafter referred to as “NTCU”) to boost exchange with the international community, solicit outstanding international students to be admitted to NTCU and provide incentives to current students remarkable in both academic studies and conduct.
- II. The funds required under the Guidelines shall come from NTCU’s School Affair Fund.
- III. Eligible applicants for the Scholarships:
Newly admitted and currently enrolled international students who entered the University through its international student admission channel (excluding students on extended study, overseas Chinese students, Hong Kong and Macao students, mainland Chinese students, and exchange students).
Applicants under the preceding paragraph may not concurrently receive any scholarships provided by the Government of the Republic of China or any other scholarships established by the University under its separate enhanced recruitment regulations.
- IV. Scholarship Application Time and procedures:
 - A. International freshman students: Fill out the Scholarship Application Form while applying for admission to NTCU. The application documents for admission and Scholarship will be reviewed at the same time.
 - B. Officially accredited international students currently studying at NTCU: Submit the

application to the Office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs/ Research and Development by January 31 and August 31 every year.

V. Review:

- A. International freshman students: Scholarship application form and documents required for application for NTCU admission.
- B. Officially accredited international students currently studying at NTCU: Scholarship application form and the academic transcripts of NTCU in the preceding semester and a photocopy of the current term student identity certificate.
- C. The International Students Scholarships/Fellowships Review Panel organized by the office of International and Cross-Strait Affairs / Research and Development shall assume the responsibility to review and grant the Scholarship, by selecting the qualified applicants based on their average scores, ranks in the classes and extraordinary performances.

VI. Contents of the Scholarship:

- A. International freshman students (beginning from either the Spring Semester or the Fall Semester, excluding transfer students): Tuition and miscellaneous fees waived in the first year (two semesters).
- B. Officially accredited international students currently studying at NTCU:
 - 1. The number of awardees who study for the bachelor program is 32; 14 awardees for master's program; 4 awardees for the doctor's program.
 - 2. International students receiving the scholarship must have achieved a conduct grade of 80 or above in the preceding semester.
 - 3. The standard is based on every applicant's academic grades. If there are excessive amounts of the same score or other special circumstances, the International Students Scholarships/Fellowships Review Panel will make a conclusion after discussion.
 - 4. Average academic score of 80 or above in the preceding academic year in case of international students in the bachelor program (four awardees); Average academic score of 90 or above in the preceding academic year in case of international students in the master's program (two awardees); Average academic score of 90 or above in the preceding academic year in case of international students in the doctoral program (one awardee). Each awardee is granted a Scholarship amounting to NT\$6,000 per month and is exempted from lodging fares throughout the schooling period (excluding summer, winter vacations).
 - 5. International students ranked 5th to 12th in the bachelor's program (with an average academic score of 75 or above), 3rd to 6th in the master's program (with an average academic score of 85 or above), and 2nd in the doctoral program (with an average

academic score of 85 or above) at the time of scholarship approval are eligible for the award. Each awardee will receive a scholarship of NT\$4,000 per month for the relevant academic year, and will be exempt from accommodation fees during the semester period (excluding summer and winter vacations).

6. Average academic score of 70 or above in the preceding academic year in case of international students in the bachelor program (twenty awardees); Average academic score of 80 or above in the preceding academic year in case of international students in the master's program (eight awardees); Average academic score of 80 or above in the preceding academic year in case of international students in the doctoral program (two awardees). Each awardee is granted a Scholarship amounting to NT\$2,000 per month and is halved for lodging fares throughout the schooling period (excluding summer, winter vacations).

- C. The Scholarship may be granted a maximum of four years for international students in the bachelor program, two years for international students in the master's program and three years for international students in the doctoral program.

VII. International students who receive this scholarship from the second academic year onward are required to assist with relevant work assigned by their department or administrative units for 64 hours per semester, and such service shall be taken into consideration when applying for the scholarship in the following semester.

VIII. The Scholarship is granted on a monthly basis during the periods where the awardees are studying with NTCU; from August till January for international students in the autumn semester, from February till July for international students in the spring semester. The graduating students may lodge in the NTCU student dorms based on the semesters, till June 30 and January 31 respectively.

IX. NTCU grants applicants recommended by partner institutions according to dual and specific MOU.

X. These Guidelines and amendments hereof shall come into enforcement after being officially resolved by the Administrative Council of NTCU.

The authority in charge of these Guidelines is the International Affairs and Research & Development Division. These Guidelines were officially resolved in the 4th Administrative Meeting of Academic Year 2025 (December 9, 2025), officially approved by the NTCU President on December 15, 2025 and promulgated on December 23, 2025.

Article 1 To encourage international students to pursue higher education in Taiwan, National Taichung University of Education (hereinafter referred to as “the University”) has established the Regulations for Admission of International Students at National Taichung University of Education (hereinafter referred to as “these Regulations”) in accordance with the Ministry of Education’s Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan and the relevant academic regulations of the University.

Article 2 An individual of foreign nationality who has never held nationality status from the Republic of China (R.O.C.) and meets the following qualifications may apply for admission in accordance with these Regulations:

1. Has never undertaken studies in Taiwan as an overseas compatriot student.
2. Has not been admitted to any academic institution in Taiwan in the current academic year through placement by the University Entrance Committee for Overseas Compatriot Students in accordance with the Regulations Regarding Study and Counseling Assistance for Overseas Compatriot Students in Taiwan.

An individual of foreign nationality who meets the following qualifications and who has continuously resided overseas for no less than six years at the time of application may also apply for admission in accordance with these Regulations:

1. An individual who also held R.O.C. nationality at the time of application but has never had household registration in Taiwan.

2. An individual who previously held R.O.C. nationality but no longer holds R.O.C. nationality at the time of application shall have renounced R.O.C. nationality for at least eight years from the date of approval by the Ministry of the Interior.
3. Individuals described in the preceding two subparagraphs must also comply with Subparagraphs 1 and 2 of Paragraph 1.

Foreign nationals who were selected by a foreign government, institution, or school under an education cooperation agreement to study in Taiwan and have never had household registration in Taiwan may apply for admission with approval from the Ministry of Education and are exempt from the restrictions prescribed in the preceding two paragraphs.

The six-year period referred to in Paragraph 2 shall be calculated retroactively from the starting date of the intended semester of admission (February 1 or August 1).

“Overseas” as referred to herein means countries or regions other than Mainland China, Hong Kong, and Macao. “Continuous residence” means that the international student may not stay in Taiwan for more than 120 days in any calendar year. If the years during which overseas residence is calculated are not complete calendar years, the applicant shall still be considered as having continuously resided overseas if the period of stay in Taiwan during those years does not exceed 120 days. However, the following circumstances, when supported by relevant documentation, are exempted, and the duration of stay in Taiwan shall not be included in the calculation of overseas residence:

1. Enrollment in an Overseas Youth Vocational Training Program organized by the competent authority for overseas compatriot affairs or in a technical training class accredited by the Ministry of Education.
2. Enrollment in a Chinese Language Center at a university or college approved by the Ministry of Education to recruit international students, for a total period of less than two years.
3. Participation in an exchange student program for a total period of less than two years.
4. Internship in Taiwan approved by the central competent authority, for a total period of less than two years.

An individual of foreign nationality who concurrently held R.O.C. nationality and who had applied for loss of R.O.C. nationality before the amended Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan came into effect on February 1, 2011 may apply for admission in accordance with the original regulations and is exempt from the restrictions prescribed in Paragraph 2.

Any individual who meets the conditions stipulated in Article 2 of the Nationality Act shall be deemed to possess R.O.C. nationality under these Regulations.

Article 3

An individual of foreign nationality who concurrently holds permanent residency status in Hong Kong or Macao, has never had household registration in Taiwan, and has continuously resided in Hong Kong, Macao, or overseas for no less than six years at the time of application may apply for admission in accordance with these Regulations.

“Continuous residence” as referred to in the preceding paragraph means that the applicant may not stay in Taiwan for more than 120 days in any calendar year. However, the circumstances listed in

Subparagraphs 1 through 4 of Paragraph 4 of the preceding Article, when supported by

relevant documentation, are exempted, and the duration of stay in Taiwan shall not be included in the calculation of continuous residence.

An individual who was formerly a resident of Mainland China, currently holds foreign nationality, has never had household registration in Taiwan, and has continuously resided overseas for no less than six years at the time of application may apply for admission in accordance with these Regulations.

“Continuous residence” as referred to in the preceding paragraph means that the applicant may not stay in Taiwan for more than 120 days in any calendar year. However, the circumstances listed in Subparagraphs 1 through 4 of Paragraph 4 of the preceding Article, when supported by relevant documentation, are exempted, and the duration of stay in Taiwan shall not be included in the calculation of continuous overseas residence.

The six-year period referred to in Paragraphs 1 and 3 shall be calculated retroactively from the starting date of the intended semester of admission (February 1 or August 1).

The definition of “overseas” referred to in Paragraphs 1 through 4 shall follow the provisions of Paragraph 4 of the preceding Article.

Article 4

International students applying to study in Taiwan in accordance with Articles 2 and 3 may do so only once. Those wishing to continue their studies in Taiwan shall follow the same admission procedures as domestic students.

An international student under any of the following circumstances is exempt from the restriction prescribed in the preceding paragraph when reapplying to continue studies in Taiwan or applying again to study in Taiwan:

1. After completing the program at the institution originally applied to, the student applies for a master’s degree program or above, in accordance with the University’s regulations.
2. An international student who applied for a program at the bachelor’s degree level or below, has stayed in Taiwan for less than one year, and withdrew or lost student status due to any reason may reapply to study in Taiwan once only.
3. An international student who meets the requirements of Paragraph 1 of Article 2 and applies for admission to the University’s bachelor’s degree program may do so once only.

An international student who has completed a bachelor’s degree or above in Taiwan may apply for admission to a master’s degree program or above by submitting a diploma and academic transcripts issued by a Taiwanese institution in accordance with Article 6, and is exempt from submitting overseas academic credentials as prescribed in Subparagraph 2, Paragraph 1 of Article 6.

An international student who meets the requirements of Paragraph 1 of Article 2 and has completed a program at the associate degree level or below in Taiwan may apply for admission to a bachelor’s degree program in accordance with Article 6 by submitting the diploma and academic transcripts from the completed program and is exempt from submitting overseas academic credentials as prescribed in Subparagraph 2, Paragraph 1 of Article 6.

An international student who graduates from the University and is approved by the Ministry of Education, through University recommendation, to undertake an internship in Taiwan may extend international student status for up to one year after graduation.

An international student who, during the period of study in Taiwan, is permitted to establish household registration for the first time, transfer household registration, naturalize, or restore R.O.C. nationality shall lose international student status and shall be dismissed from the University. However, this restriction does not apply under the following circumstances:

1. The student was admitted through the same procedures as domestic students.
2. The student acquires R.O.C. nationality through naturalization pursuant to Subparagraphs 1 through 3, Paragraph 1 of Article 4 of the Nationality Act.
3. The student meets the requirements of Paragraph 1 of Article 2 and acquires R.O.C. nationality through naturalization pursuant to Articles 3 through 7 of the Nationality Act.

An international student who is dismissed or loses student status from the admitting institution due to unsatisfactory conduct, failure to meet academic requirements, or serious violation of laws or school regulations may not reapply for admission under Paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Article. If any violation is verified, the University shall revoke admission eligibility or expel the student.

Article 5

The actual number of international students admitted by the University each academic year shall, in principle, not exceed an additional ten percent of the student enrollment quota approved by the Ministry of Education for the previous academic year. Such admissions shall be included in the total enrollment quota for the current academic year and submitted to the Ministry of Education for approval. If the proposed number of international students exceeds the additional ten percent quota, the University shall submit an enrollment expansion plan, including quality control strategies and supporting measures, for approval by the Ministry of Education. However, degree programs jointly established with foreign universities and specially approved by the Ministry of Education are exempt from this restriction.

If there are unfilled admission quotas for domestic students within the total approved enrollment quota of the previous academic year, such vacancies may be filled by international students upon approval by the Ministry of Education.

The enrollment quotas referred to in Paragraph 1 do not include international students without official student status.

Article 6

The University recruits international students for Spring and Fall semesters and independently administers all international student admissions affairs, including overseas in-person and online education exhibitions, promotional activities, and assistance with necessary procedures for studying in Taiwan. The University does not commission external organizations, legal entities, groups, or individuals to handle such matters. Admissions information shall be announced on the international student application system. Applications for Spring Semester bachelor's, master's, and doctoral programs shall be submitted between August 1 and October 31 each year. Applications for Fall Semester bachelor's, master's, and doctoral programs shall be submitted between February 1 and April 30 each year. International applicants shall submit the following documents to the Office of International Affairs within the designated application period. Late submissions shall not be accepted for any reason:

1. Admission application form and declaration statement (to be completed online through the application system website).
2. Academic credentials:

- (1) Academic credentials from Mainland China shall be processed in accordance with the Regulations Governing the Recognition of Educational Records from Mainland China.
- (2) Academic credentials from Hong Kong or Macao shall be processed in accordance with the Regulations Governing the Examination and Recognition of Educational Records from Hong Kong and Macao.
- (3) Academic credentials from other regions:
 - i. Academic credentials from overseas Taiwanese schools and schools for the children of Taiwanese business people in Mainland China shall be regarded as equivalent to those of schools at the same level in Taiwan.
 - ii. Academic credentials from foreign schools other than those described above shall be processed in accordance with the Regulations Governing the Assessment and Recognition of Foreign Academic Records by Institutions of Higher Education. However, academic credentials from foreign schools or branch campuses located in Mainland China shall be notarized by a Mainland China notary office and authenticated by an organization established or designated by the Executive Yuan or by a private organization commissioned by the Executive Yuan.
3. Study plan in Chinese or English.
4. Autobiography in Chinese or English.
5. Proof of sufficient financial support for studying in Taiwan (at least USD 3,500), or proof of a full scholarship provided by a government agency, the University, or a private organization.
6. Additional documents required by the respective department, institute, or degree program.
7. Application fee.

When reviewing international student applications, if the University has doubts regarding foreign documents described in Subparagraphs 2, 5, and 6 of Paragraph 1 that have not been authenticated by an overseas mission, an organization established or designated by the Executive Yuan, or a commissioned private organization, the University may require authentication. If such documents have already been authenticated, the University may request assistance in verification.

Upon registration, newly admitted students shall submit proof of medical and accident insurance valid for at least six months from the date of entry into Taiwan. Continuing students shall submit proof of enrollment in Taiwan's National Health Insurance or other relevant insurance coverage. Insurance certificates issued overseas shall be authenticated by an overseas mission.

- Article 6-1 An international student who submits any certificate or document as part of their application for admission to an educational institution that is found to be forged, fabricated, or that has been altered in some way shall have their enrollment eligibility revoked. If the student has already registered and begun classes, their registration as a current student shall be cancelled and they will not be awarded any certification whatsoever regarding their related academic undertakings. If any such circumstances are first discovered after a student has already graduated, the University shall revoke the former student's eligibility to graduate and shall require any degree already awarded to be returned and shall rescind it.
- Article 7 The minimum admission standard for international students shall be passing grades in every subject for every semester at the applicant's previous school.
- Instruction at the University is primarily conducted in Chinese (Mandarin), while some departments, institutes, or degree programs are taught entirely in English. Applicants to English-taught programs shall submit proof of English proficiency equivalent to CEFR B1 level or above. Applicants to non-English-taught programs shall submit proof of Chinese proficiency equivalent to TOCFL A2 level or above. Each department, institute, or degree program shall establish its own language proficiency requirements for admission.
- Article 8 Departments, institutes, and degree programs admitting international students shall establish admission review or selection procedures and admission standards for international students, which shall be implemented after approval by the International Student Admission Review Committee.
- Article 9 The review procedures for international student admissions are as follows:
1. The Office of International Affairs shall first review all application documents for completeness. Qualified applications shall be forwarded to the respective departments, institutes, or degree programs for preliminary review through relevant meetings by November 15 for Spring Semester admissions and May 15 for Fall Semester admissions. During the preliminary review stage, departments, institutes, or degree programs may require applicants to take examinations in specialized subjects or Chinese language proficiency tests if necessary.
 2. Departments, institutes, or degree programs receiving applications shall submit meeting records and application documents to the Office of International Affairs by November 30 for Spring Semester admissions and May 30 for Fall Semester admissions for secondary review by the International Student Admission Review Committee.
 3. The International Student Admission Review Committee shall consist of the Dean of the Office of International Affairs, the Dean of Academic Affairs, the Dean of Student Affairs, the deans of each college, the heads of departments, institutes, or degree programs admitting international students, and relevant administrative officers. The committee shall be convened by the Dean of the Office of International Affairs. Review meetings shall be held by December 10 for Spring Semester admissions and June 10 for Fall Semester admissions to conduct secondary review of applicants approved in the preliminary review stage. After approval by the University President, admission letters shall be issued. Admission letters shall specify the student's name, institution name, degree program, language of instruction, academic year and

semester start date, standards governing the collection and refund of tuition and fees, scholarships and bursaries, and other relevant information that should be communicated to the international student in both Chinese and English. Versions in the student's native language may also be provided to ensure understanding of rights and obligations related to studying in Taiwan. The Student Guidance Section, Office of Student Affairs shall promptly register matters such as admission, enrollment, transfer, suspension, withdrawal, changes or loss of student status, and departure in the international student information management system designated by the Ministry of Education.

- Article 10 If an international student registers and enrolls before one-third of the first semester of the academic year has elapsed, the student may enroll in that semester. If more than one-third of the first semester has elapsed, the student shall enroll in the second semester or the following academic year. However, this restriction shall not apply where otherwise stipulated by the Ministry of Education.
- Article 11 An international student who is already studying in Taiwan and transfers to a bachelor's degree program of the University may apply for admission into the second year of the program or into the year of a related field of study. Application procedures and admission reviews shall be handled in accordance with Articles 6 and 9.
An international student who has been dismissed from a previous institution due to unsatisfactory conduct or a confirmed criminal conviction may not transfer to the University. If any violation of this provision is verified, the University shall revoke admission eligibility or expel the student.
- Article 12 International students may not apply to programs offered by the University for recurrent education, including continuing bachelor's degree programs, in-service master's degree programs, or other programs conducted exclusively at night or on weekends. However, this restriction does not apply to international students who already possess legal residency status in Taiwan or to programs specially approved by the Ministry of Education.
- Article 13 Without affecting normal teaching operations, the University may enter into educational cooperation agreements with foreign schools to admit international exchange students and may admit foreign nationals as non-degree students in accordance with the relevant regulations governing international student admissions.
- Article 14 If the University establishes special programs for international students due to international academic cooperation projects or other special needs, such programs shall be submitted to the Ministry of Education for approval in accordance with the relevant regulations governing enrollment scale and resource conditions for institutions of higher education.
- Article 15 If an international student suspends studies, withdraws, or has any changes to, or loses student status, the University shall notify the Bureau of Consular Affairs of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the local service center of the National Immigration Agency where the University is located, with a copy sent to the Ministry of Education.
- Article 16 To encourage outstanding international students to study at the University, the University has established scholarships for international students, with separate regulations governing such scholarships.

- Article 17 The Office of International Affairs is responsible for handling applications for the admission and transfer of international students. The Student Guidance Section, Office of Student Affairs is responsible for counseling, communication, and assistance related to the daily life and academic affairs of international students after enrollment. The University shall also organize international student counseling activities or campus internationalization activities periodically each academic year to promote interaction and exchange between domestic and international students.
- Article 18 Fees payable by international students shall be handled in accordance with the following provisions:
1. Recipients of the MOFA Taiwan Scholarship recommended by overseas missions individuals holding permanent residency status in Taiwan shall be charged according to the tuition and fee standards applicable to domestic students.
 2. Students admitted under educational cooperation agreements shall be charged according to the provisions of such agreements.
 3. International students other than those described in the preceding two subparagraphs shall be charged according to standards established by the University, which shall not be lower than the fee standards of private institutions at the same academic level.
- Article 19 International students studying at the Chinese Language Center affiliated with the University shall submit the following documents when applying: an application form, proof of sufficient financial support for studying in Taiwan or proof of a full scholarship provided by a government agency, the University, or a private organization, and other documents required by the Chinese Language Center. Other notifications concerning management or changes to or loss of student status shall be handled mutatis mutandis in accordance with Paragraph 2 of Article 6, Article 9, and Article 15 of these Regulations.
- Article 20 If an international student is found to have violated the Employment Service Act, the University shall handle the matter immediately in accordance with relevant regulations.
- Article 21 Any matters not provided for in these Regulations shall be handled in accordance with the Regulations Regarding International Students Undertaking Studies in Taiwan, the University's Academic Regulations, and other related regulations.
- Article 22 These Regulations and any amendments thereto shall be implemented after approval by the Academic Affairs Meeting and submission to the Ministry of Education for approval.
